- **John Walvoord wrote**, “A careful study of the nature of the filling of the Holy Spirit will reveal that it is *the source of all vital spiritual experience* in the life of the Christian.”

## **III. Baptism (1 Cor. 12:13—“The act whereby the Holy Spirit joins believers to the body of Christ.”)**

- In all, there are eleven specific references to spirit baptism in the New Testament (Matt 3:11; Mark 1:8; Luke 3:16; John 1:33; Acts 1:5; 11:16; Rom 6:1–4; 1 Cor 12:13; Gal 3:27; Eph 4:5; Col 2:12).

## **A. Confusion Concerning the Spirit's Baptizing**

- 1. Because Experience Is Exalted Above the Bible**
- 2. Because There Is an Unclear Concept of the Body of Christ**
- 3. Because of the Association of Spirit Baptism with a "Second Blessing" and/or with the Experience of Tongues-speaking**
- 4. Because the Baptism of the Spirit and the Filling of the Spirit Are Not Distinguished**

## **B. Characteristics of the Spirit's Baptizing**

- 1. It Is Operative Only in This Stewardship (Since Pentecost)**
- 2. It Is Experienced by All Believers in This Stewardship (1 Cor. 12:13)**
- 3. It Occurs at Salvation and Is Not Repeated Thereafter**

	<b>BAPTISM</b>	<b>FILLING</b>
<b>Key Text</b>	1 Cor. 12:13	Eph. 5:18
<b>Extent</b>	Every believer	Those who have believed and yielded to Christ
<b>Frequency</b>	Once for all at salvation	Repeated after salvation
<b>Time</b>	Same time as salvation	Repeated experience throughout life
<b>Permanence</b>	Lasts a lifetime	Needs to be repeated because of human frailty
<b>Results</b>	...in a position (in Christ)	...in a power (Christ in us)
<b>Prerequisites</b>	Faith in Christ	Yieldedness
<b>Command</b>	None	Yes (Eph. 5:18)
<b>Source</b>	Experience of the believer at salvation through the Spirit	The Spirit of God through the Word of God
